Description: A painting created to evoke the solitude and peace and quiet that I found whilst visiting St Martins Bay on St Martins Island in the Isles of Scilly last April. The beach was so atmospheric with mist out to sea, in beautiful contrast to the seaweed laden shoreline and white sand, There were pockets of turquoise water to indicate the shallows and I spent a couple of hours sketching and painting before it started to rain and I returned to the hotel for Sunday lunch. The painting was created back in my studio in Stratford Upon Avon over several months building up the layers of oil paint and then scrapping or rubbing back in areas until I had captured the mood and atmosphere that I remembered on St Martins earlier in the year.
